Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2015/16

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. OFSTED will play a significant role in ensuring that schools target this funding in areas which will lead to clear outcomes in raising standards and opportunities in PE and school sport for all children throughout the Primary Phase.

All schools will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for the next two academic years.

The aim of the Sports Grant is to improve the provision of PE and sport and to ensure that there is a lasting legacy from the activities undertaken.

Ofsted Outcomes

- Increase in participation rates in such activities as games, dance, gymnastics, swimming and athletics
- Participation and success in competitive school sports
- Growth in the range of provisional and alternative sporting activities
- Partnership work on physical education with other schools and other local partners

This year our decisions on allocating funding are intended to;

- Increase PE and games provision across the school with respect to all pupils
- Employ expert advice to evaluate the school's current strengths and weaknesses in PE and sport, and implement plans for improvement.

- Maintain the commitment to competitive sporting competitions and raise the profile of inter- and intra-school competition
- Embed the investment within the School Improvement Plan to ensure there is a strategy for the development of teacher confidence and competence and a lasting legacy in outcomes for pupils
- Collaborative work in school clusters to develop a higher quality provision.
- Improving staff professional learning to upskill teachers and teaching assistants
- Invest in published schemes of work for dance and gymnastics
- Give children experience of alternative activities
- Develop our limited outside area to improve our provision of Outdoor and Adventurous Activities
- Ensure Physical Development in EYFS by providing a wider range of activities
- Secure time for the subject leader to undertake reviews and construct further development plans
- Improve resources available

Planned Spending 2015/16- approx. costs

- £150 entry to tournaments
- £1,000 Purchase new schemes of work for Gymnastics and Dance- ensure progression of skills and activities across the school
- £1,000 Buy more balance and small pedal bikes for EYFS and extend Balancability curriculum into year 1
- £1038.75 Staff Training, DT/EB attend National PE Conference
- £863 Supply cover for staff CPD
- £500 Supply cover for development of cluster work with Partnership Schools
- £1,500 School Sports Week to coincide with national Sports week and Rio Olympics- activities tbc but to include Enable Me- disability sports
- £500 Opportunities for children to experience new activities and curriculum enrichment Sports Activities at Broadbridge Heath for Year R, 1 and 2 Beach Volley Ball for Y6
- £1,500 Purchase resources identified as needed to deliver curriculum
- £1,000 Continue to develop Forest School and other outside areas
